Alabama	No	No	System in place whereby consumers may be authorized to have alcohol beverages, which are not offered in state, shipped to AL ABC store to ensure collection of taxes and delivery to a person at least 21 years old.
Idaho	Yes	Yes	Table wine and beer only. Alcohol beverages cannot be imported into state to any licensed retailer, bar, tavern or restaurant. Only beverages less than 14% alcohol can be imported. An in-state winery could ship to an Idaho adult, it would not be good.
Iowa	Yes	Yes	Wine only. May ship up to 18 liters per customer per month provided State has a reciprocal law such as Iowa's.

Montgomery Co., MD	Yes	No	Within licensed jurisdiction (Montgomery County) transaction must be done on licensed premises.
Michigan	Yes	Yes	The retailer or winery must have a Michigan liquor license. Delivery person must be 18 yr. Of age and recipient 21 yr. and not visibly intoxicated. Very few establishments deliver due to potential liability. Some offer internet orders as in grocery store. Shipping containers must clearly indicate package contains alcoholic liquor. Age of person placing order and receiving shipment must be verified to be 21 years of age or older.

New Hampshire	Yes	Yes	Refer to NH direct shipping law RSA 178:14-a
North Carolina	No	No	In-state retailers may ship beer and wine to NC customers; NC wineries may ship wine to NC customers. Both may ship to out-of-state customers if lawful in other jurisdiction.
Ohio	Yes	Yes	Holders of A,B,C or D permit may make deliveries of beer, intoxicating liquor containing not more than 21% alcohol by volume.
Oregon	Yes	Yes	Winery licensee is authorized to ship not more than 2 cases of wine per month for personal use and not for resale, containing not more than 9 liters per case to any resident in state at least 21 years of age. Shipping container must be clearly labeled.

Vermont	Yes (wine only)	No	Residents of Vermont may be permitted to receive alcohol beverages from out of state shippers.

West Virginia	An adult resident or duly licensed retailer or distributor of alcoholic beverages in a state or nation which affords adults and duly licensed retailers and distributors of the state an equal shipping privilege may ship from for personal use and not for resale, not more than 2 cases of wine per month, not to exceed eighteen liters of wine in any month to any adult resident in the state. The containers must me clearly labeled it cannot be delivered to anyone under 21 and advertising the availability of wine is not allowed.
